

In 1956, **Ronald Gregory** was appointed Director of Bands at Indiana University, following interim directors Kenneth Snapp and Michael Bowles. He came to Indiana from the University of Utah where he had held an appointment as Director of Bands. He served as national president of Kappa Kappa Psi from 1957-1959, and was a member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association. He served as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator in 40 states, Canada, and Europe. He studied advanced orchestral conducting with Louis Fourestier, conductor of the Paris Opera, and with Franco Farrara of the St. Cecilia Conservatory in Rome. After leaving Indiana University in 1966 he served for many years as the Dean of the School of Music at Millikin University in Decatur, Illinois.
