The grade in each semester of<br>performance study must be B or higher. Option no. 1 (auditioning before a faculty<br>committee) may be used only during the first two semesters of enrollment. Students<br>should consult the appropriate performance department chair for detailed information<br>on the required level.<br><b>Styles Examination</b><br>All Doctoral students must take the Styles exam in their first spring semester of<br>enrollment. Students who pass the exam meet the requirement. Students who do not<br>pass the exam may retake the exam once with permission of the director of graduate<br>studies, if their score is within a range recommended by the Doctoral Styles<br>Committee.
